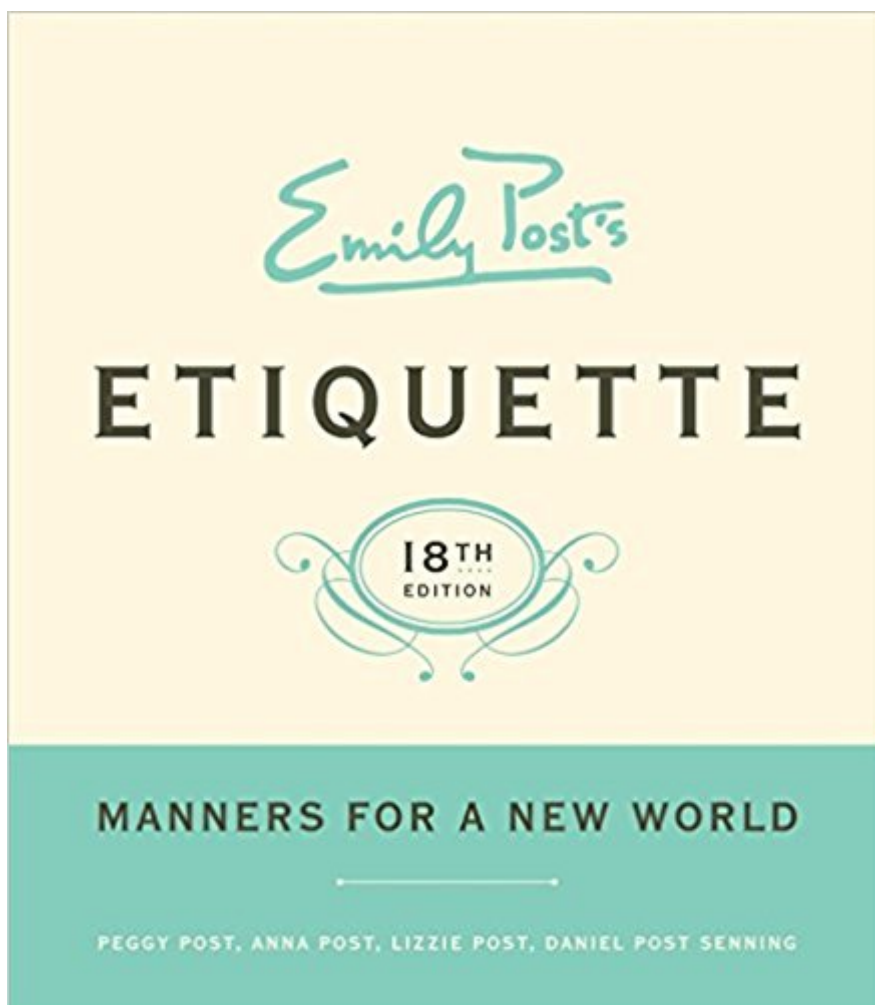


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Emily Post's Etiquette, 18th Edition (Emily Post's Etiquette)
