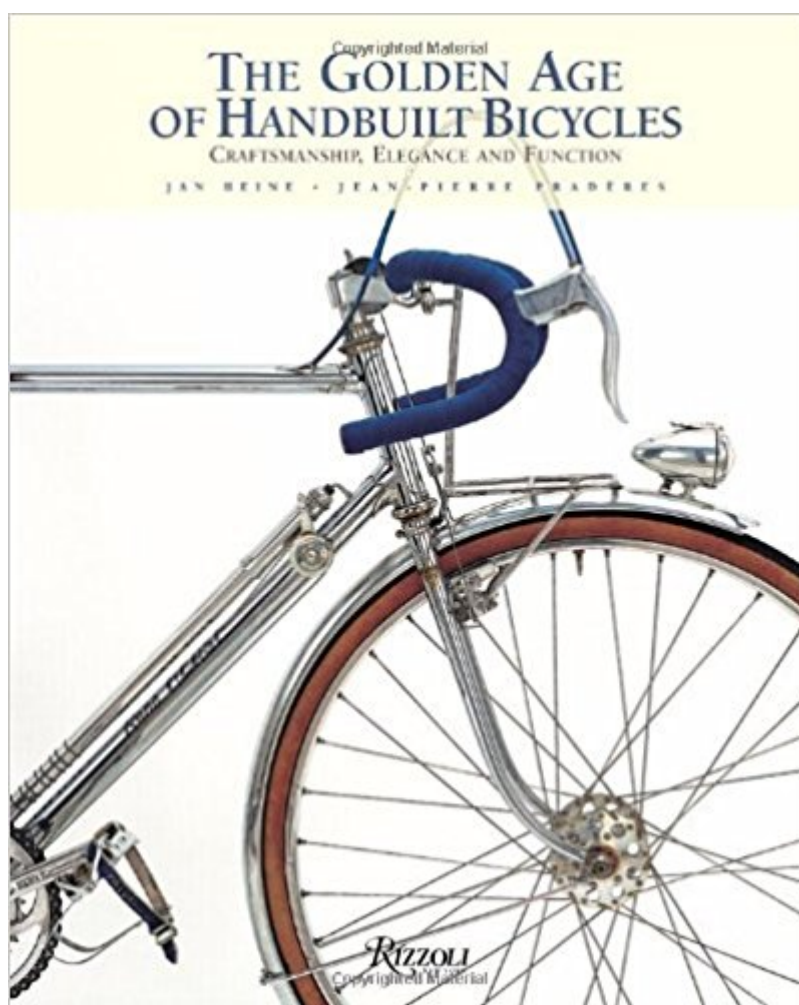

Beautifully detailed are early-twentieth-century models with multi-gear systems, mid-century machines where war and postwar economy challenged craft and utility, as well as modern and contemporary bicycles. Featured artisans and brands include La Gauloise, Reyhand, Schulz, Barra, Alex Singer, and Renée Herse. With brilliant full-color images of each model and chronological text detailing the craftsmanship that went into producing these elegant machines, this book will appeal to bicycle enthusiasts and to anyone interested in design.

Beautiful book with many unique and rare bicycles. A must get for the cyclist into retro styled bicycles and certainly for those into handmade bicycles, frame building, touring and randonneuring. The book highlights handmade bikes by Rene herse, Alex singer, and others small builders from the 1910's to relatively recent. The focus is exclusively on touring, randonneuring and porteur bikes from French builders. The craftsmanship exhibited by bikes is simply stunning. There are no geometry pictures but that can be found on Google easily.

This book was purchased for my husband as a birthday gift. He had been wanting it for a long time. I was torn between the earlier edition, especially those with Jan Heine's signature (ooooo!) but, I decided to stick with a newer edition. I'm glad I did. He enjoys leafing through this book in the evening, along with other publications by Mr. Heine and other such related bike-nerd paraphernalia. :-)

This book is an important contribution to the history of bicycles. A more appropriate title might have been, "The Golden Age of Handbuilt Touring Bicycles". A quick survey reveals that 50 of the 50 bicycles featured have fenders - 46 have luggage racks and 45 are equipped with lights/generators. Just so you know what you are getting. The machines featured are wonders of imagination - starships of their day: the lavish craftsmanship is unsurpassed. Many of these bikes are turned out in all chrome. Kudos to Jan Heine, the author, for the vision to produce this book. The text is crisp and insightful - obviously the product of years of research, uh. . . strike research, insert obsession! Kudos also to Jean-Pierre Praderes. This is a doctoral thesis on how to photograph bicycles - a perfect mix of full view shots and fascinating detail. If you are a road bike nut, such as myself, you may want to buy Jan Heine's new book, "The Competition Bicycle. It will pop up with a title search on e-bay. I do not have this book yet, but, will order it based on the quality of the one reviewed here. Such a glowing review may leave you wondering if I have some financial interest in this endeavor.
