Disasters start piling up almost as soon as the plane touches down - the house is in disrepair, Nora's grandchildren are trying to evict her, and the gorgeous but chilly woman across the street seems to have a problem with Hannah's presence. When a pipe bursts on her first night in the house, Hannah has no choice but to run across the street and beg for help from Avery. The rest, as they say, is history.

Over all, I enjoyed this book. There were some good parts, and also some issues. I will start with constructive criticism. First off, this book could have benefited from another editing pass: there were quite a lot of grammatical issues, mixing of pronouns and tenses, even some missing words. Secondly, I dislike this cover. I don't feel like the women depicted represent the characters' descriptions in the book. I'm usually not a fan of putting images of a book's characters on the cover, because I like to be able to form my own image of the character based on the author's description. Now, on to my positive thoughts. These characters (Avery and Hannah, as well as Nora) are so relatable that I was totally invested from the beginning. I thought the setting was perfect, I could feel the peace of the countryside, and the slow life of the newly growing town. I could immediately feel the chemistry between Avery and Hannah, but Avery was so grumpy and Hannah was such a wounded baby duck that I wasn't sure how their story was going to develop. I also very much enjoyed the dialogue: Avery and Hannah's interactions, their arguments, their banter is all well written. And I absolutely LOVED Hannah's evolution and growth into a confident woman. She faced a lot of challenges and obstacles throughout this story. But with Avery's support, and some words from Nora's past, she realized what she was capable of, and what she wanted.

Hannah doesn't know it, but she is in an abusive relationship. She starts to see it when she leaves New York to attend her Aunt Nora's funeral and her girlfriend, Rebecca, tells her if she goes, don't come back. Avery doesn't do relationships. She doesn't want to get hurt, and is fine living alone with her occasional one night stands. She also doesn't want Nora's family living across the street from her, not after how badly they treated Nora. Both girls have their baggage, and their issues, but they soon learn that not everything is as it seems, and they both have more to give than they realized. This is a sweet story with great characters that will have you smiling as you read along, not wanting to put it down until you've read it all. I received an ARC of this story and am voluntarily leaving this review. This is my honest opinion.

Cara Malone has become one of my favorite lesfic authors. When this book begins, we meet Avery Blake is the ultimate butch who doesn't do relationships. She was extremely close to her elderly neighbor, Nora, and took away only negative feelings about love from learning about her neighbor's love affair. So naturally she wasn't thrilled when Nora's niece moved into the house after Nora's death. Hannah, an emotionally abused woman with zero confidence moved into her aunt's house

not understanding why the house was left to her. Her cousins give her grief because they want what's rightfully theirs. Avery is downright surly with Hannah the first couple of times they meet. Her feelings quickly change and she agreed to help and teach Hannah to fix up the house to sell. This was a cute story, but I didn't feel a major connection between Avery and Hannah.... their relationship burned hot and quickly fizzled out when Avery got cold feet. I feel that because it was so short there were plot and romance developments that weren't fully formed. Don't get me wrong, this is a cute read and I look forward to reading Cara's next book.
