

The Pastoral Clinic: Addiction And Dispossession Along The Rio Grande



Synopsis

The Pastoral Clinic takes us on a penetrating journey into an iconic Western landscape—northern New Mexico's Española Valley, home to the highest rate of heroin addiction and fatal overdoses in the United States. In a luminous narrative, Angela Garcia chronicles the lives of several Hispano addicts, introducing us to the intimate, physical, and institutional dependencies in which they are entangled. We discover how history pervades this region that has endured centuries of material and cultural dispossession, and we come to see its heroin problem as a contemporary expression of these conditions, as well as a manifestation of the human desire to be released from them. Lyrically evoking the Española Valley and its residents through conversations, encounters, and recollections, The Pastoral Clinic is at once a devastating portrait of addiction, a rich ethnography of place, and an eloquent call for a new ethics of care.

First, I would like to commend David E.S. Stein for his very worthwhile and supportive review. In Stein's first paragraph while referencing EspaÃ ola, stated, "it is a region that few outsiders have taken the trouble to understand...." From my knowledge of EspaÃ ola I would have carried it further and stated "and fewer, if any, other than Angela Garcia, have ever taken the time and trouble to correct," All I had to hear was that Angela Garcia's book, The Pastoral Clinic, Addiction and Dispossession along the Rio Grande, had established a connection between dispossession and heroin addiction to know that we might finally be at the cusp of making significant changes in the treatment regimen for heroin addiction. I grew up in EspaÃ ola; practiced law for twenty-five years; researched and published a book that deals specifically with the government's dispossession of the Spanish and Mexican land grants referred to in The Pastoral Clinic. I know first-hand of the disabling effect of such governmental maltreatment. To make it a five star read, you must read this book afterwards: A brilliant companion piece to her book is her husband's book, *Desert America* by Ruben Martinez, just released. The gaze of "the other" upon the cultural miasma of our border areas mixes paired, compared, contrasted thoughts and experiences of art, life, status, culture, landscape, urban, rural, ancient, modern through the metaphor of their shared vision out the window to various areas they have touched into deeply and removed, distant and up close. Both are very well written and highly engaging. The fact that they have twins makes this even more important in a pair of readings. *The New (old) West is Noir*.
