

General Mark Hertling retired in 2013 after serving almost four decades in the US Army. At the time of his retirement, he commanded US Army Europe and Seventh Army, where he led over forty thousand soldiers, cared for over one hundred thousand family members, and partnered with the armies of fifty countries in the European theater. In 2013, Hertling became a senior vice president at Florida Hospital. In retirement, he was appointed by President Obama to be one of twenty-five members of the President's Council on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition. Hertling serves as a military analyst for CNN, and he speaks and acts passionately on the subjects of leadership, national security, and health trends. Hertling holds a bachelor of science degree from the US Military Academy in 1975, and is a graduate of the Army's Staff College, the School of Advanced Military Studies, and the National War College. He holds masters of arts degrees in military art and history and international security studies, and a master of science in exercise physiology from Indiana University. He holds numerous military awards, including the Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Stars, and the Purple Heart. He has also received awards from the governments of Germany, Poland, Romania, Saudi Arabia, and Kuwait.

General Hertling has brought his four decades of military experience and leadership success into a very readable and practical book on leadership. Although it is specifically directed towards physicians, it is equally applicable for all professionals, whether attorneys, or chaplains. Leading healthcare teams is not unlike "herding cats" involving large groups of peers and near-peers, and Hertling provides an insightful, constructive, and thoroughly practical book designed to help physicians master a skill even more difficult than open-heart surgery, or complicated eye surgery, or taking care of a patient in kidney failure, or treating a young child with bacteremia and sepsis - leading other people.

This book was a great read (for anybody who is a Leadership "geek") and smartly written so that ALL audiences (not just doctors or other medical professionals) could benefit from its content. I'm an educator, and I found that even the stories related to General Hertling's experiences at Florida Hospital were great examples of the various leadership principles and/or topics within each chapter that could be applied to nearly any type of organization. I can't even begin to tell you how refreshing it was to read a Leadership book that was so compelling and interesting that it had me intrigued to see what was going to be the next story or in the next chapter. Mark Hertling was an Army officer for close to 40 years. He now trains physicians. Who better to write a book on effective leadership? His extensive knowledge in this subject is obvious by reading this book, but it is so unassuming and humble that it's easy to forget a retired three star wrote it.
