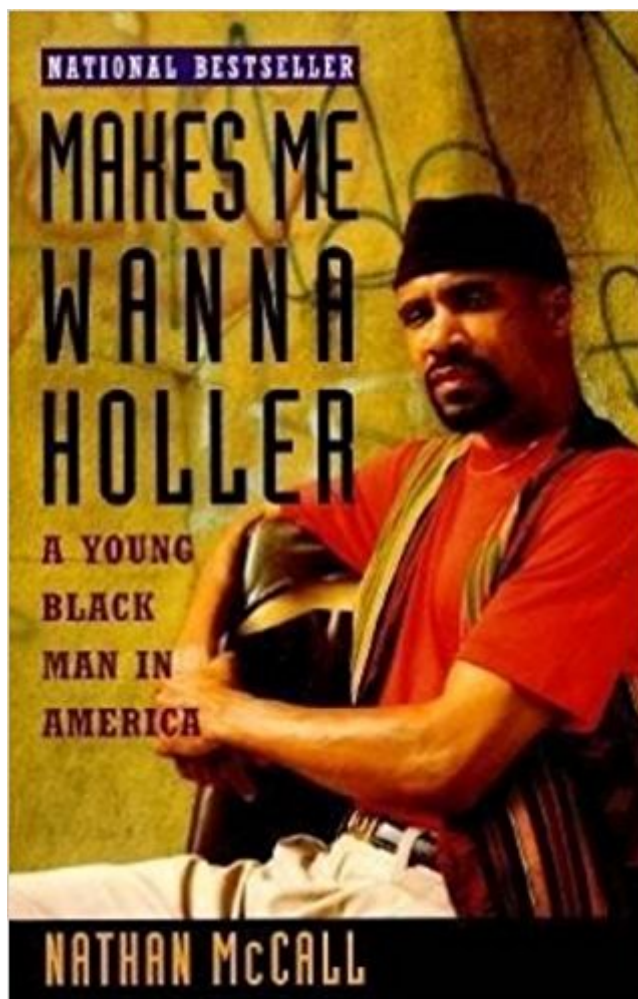

Makes Me Wanna Holler: A Young Black Man In America



Synopsis

One of our most visceral and important memoirs on race in America, this is the story of Nathan McCall, who began life as a smart kid in a close, protective family in a black working-class neighborhood. Yet by the age of fifteen, McCall was packing a gun and embarking on a criminal career that five years later would land him in prison for armed robbery. In these pages, McCall chronicles his passage from the street to the prison yard—and, later, to the newsrooms of The Washington Post and ultimately to the faculty of Emory University. His story is at once devastating and inspiring. For even as he recounts his transformation, McCall compels us to recognize that racism is as pervasive in the newsroom as it is in the inner city, where it condemns so many black men to prison, to dead-end jobs, or to violent deaths. At once an indictment and an elegy, *Makes Me Wanna Holler* became an instant classic when it was first published in 1994. It took me half the book to get into it. Nathan McCall writes beautifully and powerfully. He gives the reader a real sense of where he grew up and how he grew up, and is clearly a caring human being. He also has a strong ego, knew what he wanted along the way and got there. He could have cut the first half of the book to 2/3 the length. The interesting part is how he learned to cope with what life threw at him, and that was in the last half of the book.

I recommend this book highly for anyone not afraid to leave their comfort zone. The raw honesty and window into this life will not leave you unchanged.
