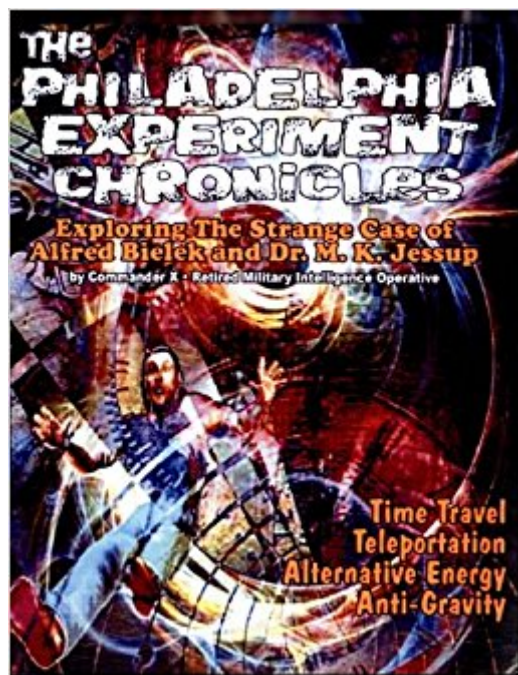




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The Philadelphia Experiment Chronicles: Exploring The Strange Case Of Alfred Bielek And Dr. M.K. Jessup

Much has been written on the subject, but this is the only account as told by a whistleblowing "insider." Retired intelligence operative Commander X reveals the story of one Alfred Bielek one of two known survivors, and the insanity he had to deal with because of this grand conspiracy that has been kept under wraps for decades.

I gave this a three star rating, a good book because it raised a lot of questions. But I also gave it three stars because it raised a lot of questions without going deep enough into them. This is my first book on this subject and I was left wondering about many of subjects that the book touched on but did not elaborate on. Including Nicoli Tesla, who was very involved with the government and experimentation at the time but only gets a few passing paragraphs with nothing in-depth on him. Much of the information in this book is fascinating. Time travel, government funded time machines, ...75 million computers in the 1950's, stolen gold bullion from Nazi germany, teleportation, time dimensions, amazing! The Gray invasion seemed a bit far-fetched (but who knows?). This book did intrigue me enough to start looking for others on these subjects. A good starting place but a little short at 137 pages. Give it a read and decide for yourself.

It seems to have been designed as a primer to whet the neophyte's interest, but unfortunately the neophyte does not come away from this book knowing substantially more than when coming to it. Too bad, because the entire saga raises a myriad of fascinating issues and questions. Perhaps this book was written merely to cash in on the perennial interest in the Philadelphia Experiment. Unfortunately, this ground is rife with tall tale tellers and out-and-out con artists. Without hard proof, the entire story is destined to remain nothing more than muddled legend and grist for the lunatic fringe's mills.

The Philadelphia Experiment Chronicles There are probably very few people on the planet who have not heard about the U. S. Navy's Philadelphia Experiment from the 1940's, and though the majority couldn't name the ship (Eldridge), they could certainly say something about what went wrong. Those horrors are forever interlinked in our psyche, and in movies like The Philadelphia Experiment starring Michael Pare and Nancy Allen. This is a tough book to critically review, and it has a lot of interesting concepts and information from Al Bielek, a professed survivor of the experiment. The book was originally written in 1994, and as of today, I still consider this book to be a valuable reference. This book has recently been updated with The Philadelphia Experiment Revelations!: An Update on The Philadelphia Experiment Chronicles - Exploring The Strange Case of Alfred Bielek & Dr. M.K. Jessup (2016), and this is a review of the original book version, not the

eBook. I'd also like to get the updated 2016 book for comparison purposes. There is a lot of controversy over the decades that have been written about this pre-Roswell government experiment, which is what you would expect. I have found multiple references to the late Dr. M. K. Jessup in past UFO literature, so what Commander X wrote about the life of this respected researcher was very important. There is a lot of interesting stuff in this, but you have to have an open mind, and most importantly, a little background knowledge in science would be helpful. Fortunately, there are other sources on DVD (The Truth about the Philadelphia Experiment by Reality Films/or the Philadelphia Experiment Revealed: Final Countdown To Disclosure (2011), also by Reality Films- which I have thoroughly watched) where the interviews in these documentaries shed additional light. The Philadelphia Experiment and Phoenix Project are still controversial to this day. This book makes an excellent starting point in your quest for truth, especially now that they've had 70 years to perfect the technology.

I HAVE READ JUST ABOUT EVERYTHING ON THE PHILADELPHIA I have always had this fascination with the Philadelphia Exp ever since I read a book years ago by the late Dr M K Jessup which touched on the subject. This book is the only one I know of in print that gives the details of Jessup's unfortunate passing -- which though reported as a suicide may not have been. Commander X with his military intelligence operative background comes closer to the truth than any other researcher on the Phila Exp. Jessup was found inside his car his death caused by carbon monoxide ... his car windows were rolled up and sealed. A doctor passing thru the park found his body and pronounced him dead on the spot. Shortly before his death he had told close friends that he had found out more details on the Phila Exp and planned to expose them to the world. The rest of the book deals with the case of Al Bielek who is the only known survivor. His story is fascinating and makes for good reading. The book reads like a good mystery novel.
