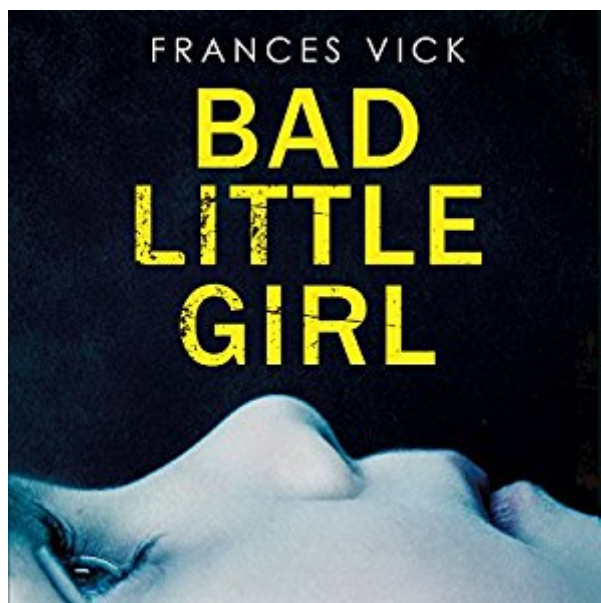


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Bad Little Girl

This is a well-written story, but as a thriller/mystery reader I somehow expected more from it. Although the characters were believable, the story moved rather slowly and I didn't find as many twists and turns as I had anticipated. Once the character of Marianne was introduced, I felt like I knew immediately where the story was going to go. I wanted to identify more with the character of Claire, but found myself unable to be attached to such an insecure woman. The book is definitely worth a try, but some hard-core fans of thriller or suspense novels will not be satisfied.

My thoughts on Lorna being born bad or was her life at home the reason for her behavior, it may be a combination of both. I have worked in Special Education all my life and I have experienced several violent behaviors over the years. Some were self inflicted while others were aimed toward others. A few had loving support of family and others lived in group homes. Lorna's ability to convince others of how she was always the one being abused and she had the ability to control these situations is sad. I feel empathy for Claire as she cared so deeply for this child that it took her down the wrong road and nearly cost her her life. Even in the end, Lorna still realizes how much Claire loved her and writes her a note wanting to be back in her life. And I am sure Claire will answer that note.

Make no mistake; this was never going to be a "Who Done It" novel. I mean, if you're going to write a story in which you conclude that "the Butler did it", you don't title the book "The Butler is a Very Bad Man". So this is a "Why Done It" or "How Done It" novel. Nevertheless, knowing the "Who" doesn't detract from the masterful way in which the reader is led from the introduction of the two main characters, through the intricate path to the final outcome. Claire, the narrator of this story, is a grade school teacher who is extremely sympathetic, empathetic, and invested in her students, to the point of exposing herself to easy manipulation. I suspect that we've all had teachers like Claire. Mine was a high school Latin teacher (coincidentally also named Claire), who could be influenced by "accidentally" calling her Mom (or Mum in this case, since the novel takes place in the UK). When Claire spots Lorna on the school grounds, an obviously abused and neglected little girl, all of her instincts to protect this child kick in, and the journey begins. What follows is an intricately conceived and crafted tale of the evolution of their relationship. It's a fascinating development of the continuous rationalizations between a co-dependent and sociopath. In this story, knowing the "who" doesn't make the "why" and the "how" from being any less interesting. Recommended reading.
