

He has been privileged in making writing and travel his primary occupations in has been fortunate in living in and experiencing a variety of cultures: Spain/Ibiza, Greece, France, Afghanistan and the Indian subcontinent, the Dominican Republic and,

finally, Cuba for four years before returning to his cottage in Herefordshire.

I really enjoyed this book, and would heartily recommend it to anyone. Simon Gandolfi is the epitome of the journalistic standard, with a life history to back it up. He is an intellectual bad-ass, unafraid to speak up, and fully able to back up his opinions. He is not abusive, instead bringing a journalists' pragmatic and balanced view to a carefully considered and observed view of the world. I'm almost the same age as he when he did this trip, and now I want to follow my own young man's dream and do something similar. This book is about a motorcycle trip starting in Ushuaia in South America and ending in the American Northeast. It is the second book of a trip that started in America and ended in Ushuaia where the bike was stored for several months until he could resume the trip. I found this book so enjoyable that I'm currently reading the first book about the trip. The biggest reason the book caught my eye was that Simon did this trip on a Honda 125cc bike that he bought in Brazil. Touring on a small motorcycle is appealing on a lot of levels, not least of which is cost and availability of service, along with ease of handling. Simon is very appreciative of and attuned to sensual things: food, living conditions, physical beauty, and he brings them to life in a vivid way that makes them familiar to the reader's experience.. I am grateful that Simon did these trips and wrote such great books about them. They are classics that will be around a long time. Truly wonderful reads, that I will read again and again through the years.
