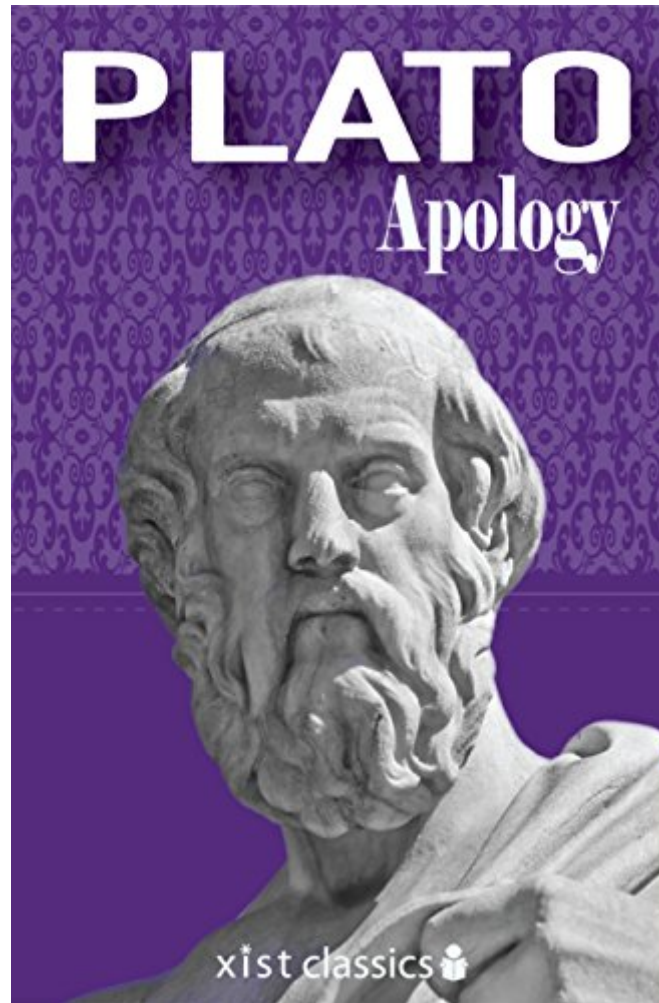




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Pretty good. A quick read. A little predictable, but that's just my opinion.
