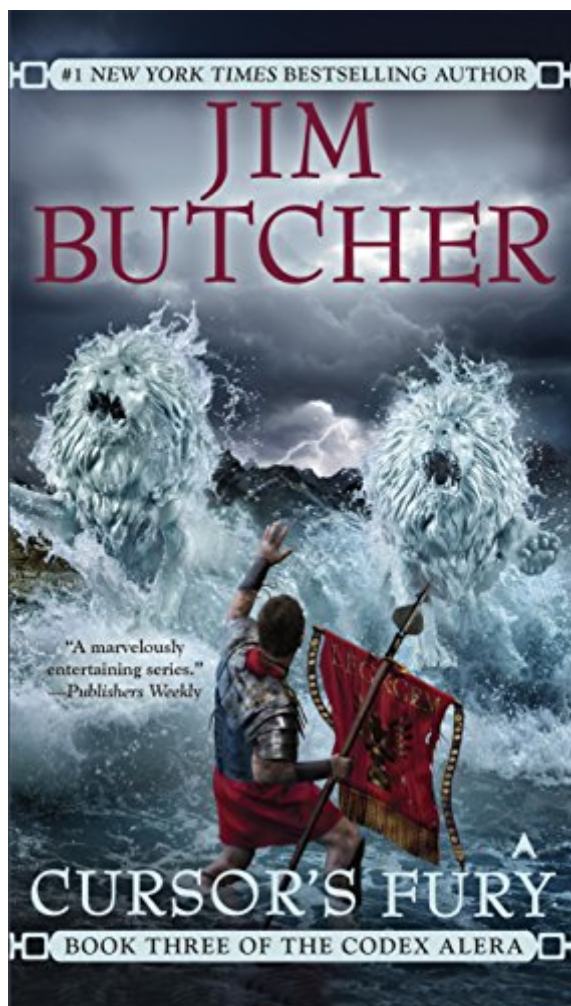

Jim Butcher never disappoints! Watching Tavi grow into manhood in this series is such a roller coaster. No one Tavi encounters is exactly who they seem to be; which causes so many unexpected situations that I'm always looking for who is going to surprise him (and me) next. But my favorite character is Kitai. She says exactly what's on her mind at every opportunity. What she says may seem like sarcasm at times, but the fact that she is being completely serious has left my sides

aching with laughter. This series is so different than what I expected. I'm a huge fan of the Dresden series, and I assumed that the Calderon series would run along the same vein. It doesn't, and I'm glad because it is a wonderful body of work on its own. Can't wait to read the next book! However, I'm disappointed that the uniforms Tavi is depicted in on the books' covers aren't how they are described in the books. Butcher does such a good job of painting these mental scenes and settings in all of his work, it just seems a shame to draw the cover otherwise. Just saying... But it doesn't take away any of the word magic Butcher performs.

Jim Butcher is an amazing story teller. I discovered him thanks to recommending his other series, the Dresden Files, to me. After getting caught up on that series and waiting for the next title to be released, I decided to check out his other series, Codex Alera. I generally don't read a lot of high fantasy, and was especially dubious about a series that started off as a bet, but wanted to give it a shot given my love of his other work. Who would have thought that the lost Roman legion and Pokémon would inspire a NYT best selling series? There is a wonderful blend of mystery, action, wit, suspense, humor, and romance in these novels and appeals to a wide audience. The story is comprised of several different character arcs artfully woven together to progress the overall plot, which helps keep things interesting and creates quite a few cliffhangers throughout each book. Overall, a great read!

This is the fourth book in Butcher's epic fantasy Fury series. Here we follow Tavi and others as they repel the Canim invasion and battle against a rebellious High Lord. There are a fair number of dark deeds done because the alternative was worse, but in the end, good prevails, of a sort. As for Tavi's personal journey, he... hmm, this gets hard without getting into spoiler territory. He picks up some new skills and learns some more about his personal history. He continues to kick butt in various ways and inspires a surprising collection of supporters to kick butt for him. And as always, he shows that the best asset in a world of dark sorcery and elemental furies, the best weapon is still calm intelligence. I did enjoy this one quite a bit, though I have to say I didn't enjoy it quite as much as the previous book *Cursor's Fury*. The writing was superb, of course, and the characters were compelling. I suspect that this time, however, the plot was not as gripping as the previous one. There was simply too much time spent getting from point A to point B, sometimes plotwise and other times geographically. Thus, when the various plots reached their climax, I felt they were about 100 pages overdue. Not that this is going to stop me from going after the last two. I'm definitely seeing this one through to the end.

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I bought this book after having read the first 3 in the "Codex Alera" series. I have given the other 3 books 5-stars and this gets one, too. I think that each book has gotten better. There is no gratuitous sex or foul language which a big plus for me. After the first book for my Kindle I got the audible versions. I gave my Kindle to my husband when I got a Kindle Fire and he read that first book. He is hooked now and has asked me to get him the other 5 in the series to read. So this book gets 2 5-star ratings and WE highly recommend this book and this series. (I am actually listening to another series by Jim Butcher because I really like his writing.)
