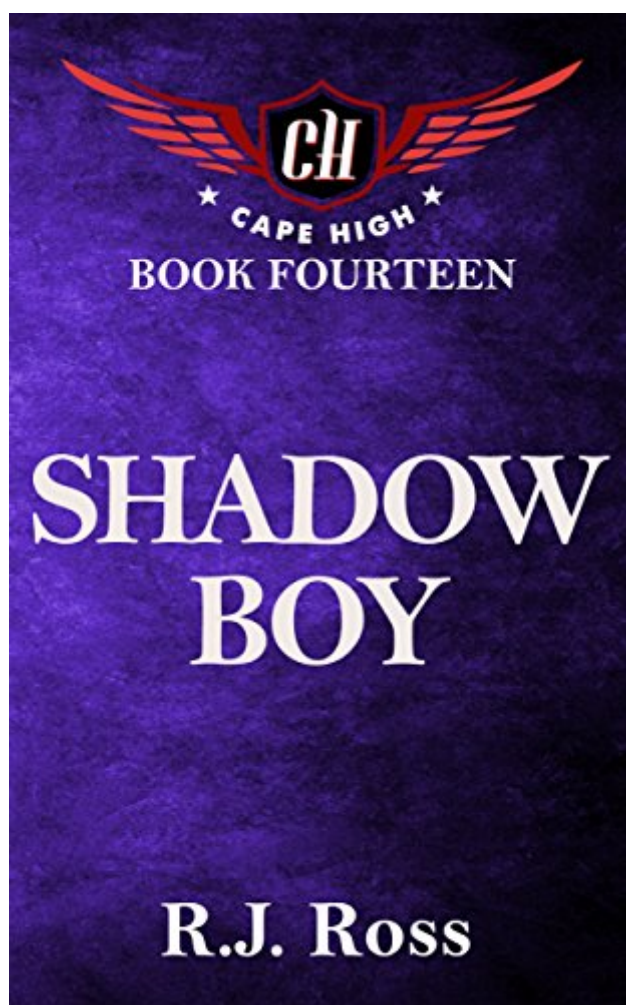


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Shadow Boy (Cape High Series Book 14)

I always enjoy the Cape High books. There's an innocence to them that is so lacking in much of YA material these days. This book was, in some ways, darker than many of the other books, but it needed to be to tell the story and wrap up the Healer arc. Rocco was excellent as a POV character and I look forward to seeing more about him as he develops into his powers and how he deals with his father. Definitely anticipating the tracking he's going to have to do moving forward given how this book ended. Carla was a delight, as always, and I hope we see her story soon, especially now that she's debuted. And given how and why she came to debut as she did, I'm hoping it will take place in the next arc as the Supers deal with the fall-out and clean-up from Herold. I loved the snippets where a few of the norms were given a tiny glimpse into the backstage of Supers-life. It will be interesting to see how much (if any) of that comes out and how it is developed, if at all. It was also good to see some homage being paid to our real-life heroes in the book - the military, hospital workers, and emergency personnel. Also, I just want to say that one of the things that truly sets the Cape High books apart from any other YA material out there (and raises it to an even higher level of quality in my eyes) is the mention of faith and belief in a higher power that she scatters throughout the book in a completely natural manner. The mentions do not feel forced or unnatural and give a lovely twist to the books, with these super powered beings acknowledging that there is something more powerful than even themselves. My only real criticism of the books is grammatical (and yes, each one of them has had the same issues). There are a few instances when the grammar choice pulls me out of the story (such as using "less" when "fewer" would be more correct). In addition, the habit of leaving out "to be" sort of irks me (i.e. "want kidnapped" instead of "want to be kidnapped") but I am aware that many younger people do tend to use these verbal shortcuts. So I know it's just my prejudice for the more classical/formal style of writing that leads me to have issues. For most

people it is likely not going to even catch your attention.

This story is narrated from the point of view of Rocco. He is a shadow walking teenager. It is the MOST action packed story out of the entire Cape High series. As far as action goes, this will set the new standard for some time to come. If by some chance you've been wanting to see how a real super villain would fair against the Hall...you got your wish with this one. This is a powerful ending to the Healers ARC. A truly enjoyable addition to my favorite universe. I enjoy the Cape High universe so much, that I have over a hundred books to read, and yet, I am rereading this series for what, the tenth time? Dive in and have some fun!

Shadow Boy is another good entry/story in the Cape High series that concludes the Healer Arc storyline with Rocco Shadowman's son working on finding his place in the world/cape society and working thru his issues with his fathers infamy and his own early choices. Its also has a development at the end of the story which injects some more really serious threats back into the world. many other heros/villians make good cameos in the book too.

I've read every book in this series, and this one has few surprises. R.J. Ross is in some ways frighteningly consistent in her action scenes and her seeming need to avoid any truly "Bad" scenes. Even the worst villains in her world are given second and third chances to turn a new leaf. At the same time that is all R.J. claims to be writing. Her stories are fun and somewhat silly lacking the dark and brooding character so many authors seemed addicted to. I would have to say this is one of the weakest in the series, but that still made it a fun read.

Another great volume of a strong series. It ventures a little further into the implications of superpowers outside the capes and celebrities model, which the series has honestly needed for a while. I continue to be an eager fan.

With Shadow Boy, R.J. demonstrates an ability to tell a grim story while feeling upbeat and hopeful. That is rare, and impressive, and worth the price of entry by itself.
