

Well, if I am planning on going anywhere out of the country, I am lost in the process of trying to know where to begin. Because I don't know the culture, the language or anything about the city or country that I am planning on visiting, I feel its best to do a lot of research before planning the trip. For instance, if I am going for 5 days and I don't know that a specific place is only open on specific days, than I can waste valuable time getting to that place and then having to recalculate the day and next planned activity. This guide goes as far as to explain the sites that are there to see, some basic history of that site, and some details you may need on that site, then they let you know a sample itinerary for say a 3, a 5, or a 7 day trip. It also goes into exchange rates for your money, and visa information. Then it also lets you know some cultural things such as simple etiquette and important customs to know. Also, it gives you some frequently used phrases and things to use to basically communicate once in the city. It is quite comprehensive for the sake of vacation purposes and I would certainly recommend this as a way to know what you are getting into, and plan the trip prior to departure. This book is great, what I love most about it is how it gives you a history of each place, so that you know why you are there and what happened in each place. What this book also gives you, which is in my opinion a great gift, an example itinerary for 3, 5 or 7 days. That way you can know what is open on certain days instead of wasting your days. I like the fact that in the book there are plans that you can help base your own trip off of. It helps especially if you do not know the language of the country because that way you have everything planned out and you wont be wandering around lost and have to ask someone who only speaks Italian where to go. This book has so much information packed into it that you should never need to feel lost or stupid while in Italy. There are so many references and guides that you will be an expert by the time you leave. I am a major history buff so

hearing more detailed history about smaller places around Italy is great and when I finally get to go this book will be so great to have with me. I always am wanting to know the History of a place and this book gives you a brief yet precise history that you will be able to relay the message onto the people you are with. These are really thoughtful travel guides. The authors think about how most of us are likely to travel and make recommendations accordingly. For these cities, they first discuss must-see sights that everyone wants to take a photo in front of: your Pantheon, your St. Peter's Basilica. After that, their built-in and customizable itineraries ask you to decide where you want to go. If you are a history buff, they send you to Ostia Antica near Rome, for a glimpse of a preserved ancient Roman town that sounds way cooler than Pompeii. If you are into a small town with that romantic European vibe, they send you elsewhere. There is a different and authentic experience in these guides for everyone.

I have been to other European countries, but I haven't yet been to Italy. Italy is one of the places I want to visit next. However it's so big, there's a lot to see and do. This guide breaks down the major cities like Rome and Florence, however it does recommend visiting smaller out of the way places, especially for food. Speaking from experience, this is true. Some of my best memories from my European trip were those in small towns. The guide also makes suggestions for restaurants and places to stay based on price. It also makes itinerary suggestions based on the stay of your visit. I like how the author mentions high points of places to visit, yet mentions the charm of the not so popular towns as well. I really liked the historical background to most places and why you should visit there. Overall, this guide is helpful and interesting. Aside from a few errors, this guide is well written.
