

He has tried to answer the question, What does emigration do to a folk-culture? And he has tried to do so, as far as possible, in the words of his informants. In the course of the book he has provided many examples of writing in Gaelic, with English translations, so that the reader may discover at first hand how closely life and language are related for the Highland settler.
